Dear Friends,

The miracle at the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee could leave you somewhat puzzled that Mary expected a carpenter to do something rather supernatural (for he had no other means) to solve the crisis of empty wine jars. Yet despite a few protests Jesus comes to the rescue and the result is a vintage stock. Asking a carpenter is one thing but asking the Messianic Christ is something quite different and all the evidence suggests that Mary shared in the Messianic mission of Jesus and prompted him to address not only the needs of the wedding guests but most importantly the Nation of Israel. They had long expected the Messiah and Isaiah prophesied that one of the signs of his presence would be the fullness of his blessings.

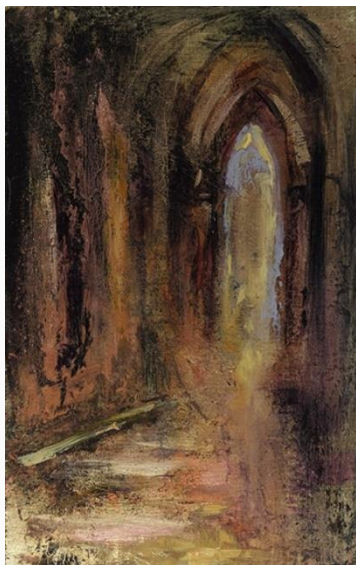
