FROM THE RECTORY DESK

Dear Friends,

The magnificent icon of the angels at the Oak of Mambre who came to visit Abraham



(Genesis 18:1-8) is just one of the many images that portray the Holy Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Nothing created by human minds will ever reveal this mystery of "One God in Three Persons", but Andrei Rublev's icon often called the "Hospitality of Abraham" is helpful in several ways and steers clear of many misinterpretations and even heretical images that are often made of the Trinity.

The silent communion of the three angels in eternal contemplation is the key feature of the painting and all three are arranged so that the lines of their bodies form a circle.

The figure on the left (God the Father) blesses the cup of the Eucharist from a distance as if to pass it to Jesus the figure in the centre. The figure in the centre (God the Son) has blue, brown and gold in his robe that represents Divinity, Humanity and Kingship. The green in the robe of God the Holy Spirit on the right, represents "new life". Unity and love are inescapable themes in the Icon.

The chalice on the table contains a calf's head, depicting sacrifice and crucifixion. In the background is the house of Abraham, the starting point for the epic Jewish journey of faith. The Oak tree representing the tree of life and Mount Moriah, symbolic of our spiritual journeying which is ascended with the help of God the Holy Spirit.

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is essential to understanding the nature of God. You will not find the word "Trinity" in the bible but the doctrine of the Trinity is revealed in so many places and our salvation is welded to it.

REMEMBER HELP US TO HELP YOU WHEN ATTENDING CHURCH IN PERSON BY OBSERVING THE FOLLOWING:



- 1. Sanitise on arrival and departure
- 2. Always wear a mask
- 3. Give your contact details when asked
- 4. Sit in the areas marked with red and white tape as directed by the Churchwardens and stay there until the service ends

- 5. Do not gather in groups before, during or after worship
- 6. Do not gather outside the churches for social conversation
- 7. Do not sing or hum with the music even if tempted to do so you will spread the virus if you are contagious and will not be aware of that if you are asymptomatic.
- 8. When you make your responses do not shout or speak loudly
- 9. Wear warm clothing because doors and windows will be kept open
- 10. Take your service sheet away with you
- 11. Drop your offering in the church plate on departure
- 12. Keep to the maximum of thirty attendance
