A message from the Diocesan Director of Mission

Accommodation for Afghan Refugees.

AR

The national church has been approached by the Home Office to help in the search for accommodation for Afghans who are seeking asylum in this country - most of these people worked for the UK government which is the primary reason for their needing to flee. They need self-contained accommodation. It would need to have:

- All relevant certification in place (e.g gas safety) and an energy performance rating of "E" or above)
- Available for letting for at least 12 months, preferably 24 months
- Ideally near good public transport links and within walking distance of main services and shops
- Available for rents at no more or close to Local Housing Allowance levels.

The Home Office resettlement scheme would meet the refugees' immediate needs and would sort out the resettlement status of the families. It would be good if local churches were able to be friend the families and help their resettlement when they arrive.


