FROM THE RECTORY DESK

Dear Friends,

The fourth Sunday in Lent and a day of refreshment in the Lenten season as we celebrate and give thanks for mothers.



Mother church, the Mother of Christ and our own mothers living or departed are the focus of our prayers today. Take time to reflect on these themes as we worship together in the gathered community. Our hearts and thoughts embrace all mothers in the Ukraine separated from family and friends and whose menfolk fight on for freedom and peace in the country they love.

The people of the Ukraine have a long association with the Blessed Virgin Mary it was Yaroslav the Wise in 1037 who dedicated Ukraine to the most Holy Mother of God. Since then, she has appeared to the people of the Ukraine at different times in their history and in different places. She has expressed her love for the people and warned of times of war and persecution. Not surprisingly the Ukrainian people honour and respect her as their patron, many soldiers even carry a patch image of her on their fatigues. She is a very real icon of hope in these devastating times.

If you have been following our Lenten Poems, then our last poem by Walt Whitman challenged us to an understanding of "miracles" Whitman believed all of life to be a miracle following in a natural order. Some might agree with that but when we turn to the bible then we are confronted with many miracles that defy the natural and can only be described as supernatural. There are many testimonies to the power of the miraculous amongst Christian believers. Some people take the view that a miracle needs further explanation and more knowledge to understand it then it will not be a miracle. For me the greatest miracle of all is Easter, hallelujah he is Risen!

Our next poem is by the Scottish poet, Edwin Muir entitled "One foot in Eden still I stand". Enjoy and share it with us next Wednesday.
