FROM THE RECTORY DESK

Dear Friends,

On Wednesday, the Bible Fellowship group will meet at the Sands church and engage in constructive conversation around selected texts from the Holy Bible. This is a great way to learn



new things about the meaning of scripture and to refresh some familiar understandings. The Bible remains the best-selling book in the world available in so many languages it is truly inspirational and the best way that God communicates with us. Sadly, the Bible is also one of the least read books and a recent survey revealed that less than 60% of Christians read their Bibles.

There are so many different translations available now, some are better than others remaining very close to the original Hebrew and Greek writings others have attempted to be more colloquial with some questionable textual interpretations. The King James Bible remains popular, the traditional language commanding a respect and dignity, however this version does not benefit from the discoveries and importance of the Dead Sea Scrolls found in a cave around 1946 at Qumran and more recent scholarly analysis. Most of the copies of the Dead Sea Scrolls are texts from the Hebrew Scriptures for example the Book of Enoch, the Book of Jubilees, the Book of Tobit, the Wisdom of Sirach and Psalms 153-156 are from the second temple period. These books were never canonized, The ere are also writings from Jewish sectarian groups including the Pesher on Habakkuk.

Whatever translation of the Bible suits you best, we shall be blessing bibles at the 9am service in the Church of the Good Shepherd today and you are welcome to bring your bible to the service. Finally, don't forget our Saints of Light pumpkin service at Seale and the Imperial College Chamber Choir Concert at SJB Puttenham.
