The reasons for people going hungry are not only related to the environment and the economy, but increasingly food and other essential commodities are being used as weapons to exert dominance and control over others. The Kremlin continues to threaten shipments of Ukrainian grain through the Black Sea, causing worldwide food shortages that can quickly default into famine.

The G20 summit is being hosted by India this year, yet ironically, it is a country that is benefitting from buying vast quantities of cheap oil when sanctions on the sale of Russian oil and gas are in place to frustrate the war against Ukraine.
